South Wirral is changing and you join us at a very exciting time. Since our new leadership team was formed a year ago, the school has gone from strength to strength. This is shown by strong improvements in our results year on year and a harder focus on attainment.

South Wirral High School offers a broad and balanced curriculum to meet the needs of all our students. Students are encouraged to be active learners who can be independent but also work cooperatively with others. We challenge students to be the best they can be, encouraging them to ask questions, take risks and be proud of their achievements.

In Year 10, subjects are divided into different pathways offering academic and vocational choices for students. The curriculum is developed in partnership with learners and parents - and each student is individually counselled as to their most suitable pathway.

In Year 9 we offer students the opportunity to choose some of the subjects they will go on to study at GCSE level. We offer students four free choices from a range of subjects. If your child is more creative they can choose a combination including Dance, Drama or Art. If

they prefer technology subjects, they can choose a combination of Design & Technology, Computer Science or Digital Photography. This helps equip them with the skills they need for careers in the 21st century. We feel that no one offers better choice than South Wirral High School.

We have an ethos based on high expectations; we expect high standards of behaviour, excellent attendance and positive attitudes.

HOUSE SYSTEM

At South Wirral, we have a house structure with four houses named after local families - Laird, Wilson, Stanley and Mayer. Each student belongs to a house from day one.

The Head of House monitors your child's whole educational experience, ensuring that the individual needs of students are met. The Head of House morally,

spiritually, socially and culturally helps to educate all students in their care, throughout their time at South Wirral. Parents of Year 7 students are invited into school to meet House staff a short time after the start of the school year, and will act in partnership to ensure your child is supported and encouraged at each stage of their development.

STUDENT SERVICES

Our Student Services Hub provides a single place students can go to for any pastoral support they may need. Here, students can speak to their Head of House, SENCo or Assistant Headteachers.

SEN

We have high expectations of your child, whatever their ability. From the beginning of their time with us, careful attention is given to identifying and assessing special educational needs by the Code of Practice. The Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator works closely with primary schools to ensure continuity of support for children who have particular learning difficulties which have already been identified at Key Stage 1 & 2.

Programmes are set up for students with Special Needs targeting their individual problems.


The department has a team of Teaching Support Assistants. This enables us to put support in place for students identified as having Special Educational Needs. Identified students will be assisted both in class and in small workshops to achieve their full potential.

LEARNING MENTORS

At South Wirral we have a team of dedicated Learning Mentors, which has been established for over 17 years with a proven record of fantastic success. Our Learning Mentors work one to one with students who may need extra pastoral support during their school journey through group work, self esteem classes and offer a nurturing service that helps our students social, emotional and mental health.

ACHIEVEMENT MONITORING AND ACADEMIC PROGRESS

We aim to raise achievement by making it easy for your child to see how well they are doing, to recognise achievement and to indicate areas for improvement. Also, student progress is monitored closely by Heads of House and Sixth Form and the Senior Leadership Team, so they can intervene when appropriate. You and your student will receive printed reports of assessments; that can also be viewed online.



A SCHOOL WHERE... We Support Fach Other

Carefully selected small tutor groups are at the heart of our pastoral system. Our tutor groups are developed with a strong focus on structured registration time - tailored to the needs of each year group.

YEARS 7 & 8

Tutors can get to know each student and their family well; they provide individual support and guidance, monitor academic progress and enthuse your child to try something new. Students take part in spelling tests and quizzes.

YEARS 9 & 10

Discussions in Year 9 & 10 turn to topics such as GCSE options, future aspirations and students' favourite books.

YEAR 11

Many of our Year 11 student groups are led by the faculty leaders of English, Mathematics and Science. This allows students to gain additional support in the lead up to examinations direct from the Head of Faculty every day. The structure allows targeted interventions to take place in a much more strategic way.

STUDENT PLANNERS

We have recently re-introduced student planners for all students at South Wirral. This is one of the many initiatives designed to improve our school and is an additional way of communicating with parents allowing you to keep up to date with home learning tasks being set. We ask parents/carers to look at the planner once a week and sign it as part of our 'Home School Agreement'.



All students are encouraged to read. Once a week each house has a dedicated 'Reading for Pleasure' session during morning registration. Our unique enrichment programme is called 'Pledges.' A Pledge is 'a promise to do or give' and we have identified ten commitments that will help your child develop spiritually, morally, socially and culturally. We will encourage them to take part in at least one activity under each different Pledge.

We have called them the 'Ten over 5 Pledges' - meaning students should aim to complete ten Pledges over five years.

THE PLEDGES

- 1. Take part in a residential experience
- 2. Perform or present to an audience in or out of school or represent the school in an activity
- 3. Attend a 'professional performance.'
- 4. Meet a person/people who can widen your knowledge of the world
- 5. Take part in an international experience
- 6. Visit and engage with a national or local park, gallery, museum, heritage site, library or archive
- 7. Visit a place of worship or spiritual significance to gain an understanding of the different cultures within society
- 8. Take part in Work-Related Learning
- 9. Join a club, society or organisation in or out of school
- 10. Actively contribute to charity work or community-based project in or out of school

South Wirral High School is at the heart of our local community both geographically and in the many ways our students get involved with helping local residents. This may include raising money for the Charles Thompson Mission, working with Claire House or entertaining elderly residents with performances.

Students are encouraged to 'give back' to their community through our Pledges programme. We have exciting partnerships with local businesses such as Merseyrail, where we have adopted Bromborough Train station with students maintaining green spaces and producing artwork to help bring colour to our community.









We have regular contact with our local primary schools, reinforcing a close relationship. We organise regular visits from our current students to perform to younger children and inviting primary students into our school to take part in sports festivals.

2017 will see the exciting introduction of a new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) initiative where local primary schools will join us in exciting and educational activities focused on developing the skills needed for careers in the future.

We also work with our global community, which is evidenced by our International Schools Award for our partnership with La Yahoushua School in Accra, Ghana. Our partnership has included visits for staff and students, who have taken equipment to donate to the school for over 7 years. Community is a key part of our ethos and we fully embrace any opportunities to work with our community.

Students who attended South Wirral High School are also invited in to offer specialist talks to current students to help inspire them on what they can achieve as part of our Alumni network. The most recent being Shaune Harrison who is now a prosthetic special makeup effects artist and has worked on films such as Harry Potter, The Avengers and Star Wars.
