We Can Succeed

South Wirral High School offers a broad and balanced curriculum to meet the needs of all our students. Students are encouraged to be active learners who can be independent but also work cooperatively with others. We challenge students to be the best they can be, encouraging them to ask questions, take risks and be proud of their achievements.

In Year 10, In addition to English, Maths, Science and the non exam subjects of PE and faith and philosophy; students will select four GCSE or vocational qualifications that they are interested in deepening their knowledge and understanding of. The curriculum is developed in partnership with the school, learners and parents - each students is provided with independent information, advice and guidance on what subjects may support them most on their journey to becoming successful learners, confident, inspired individuals and aspiring responsible citizens.

In Year 9 we offer students the opportunity to choose some of the subjects they will go on to study at GCSE level. We offer students four free choices from a range of subjects. If your child is more creative they can choose a combination including Dance, Drama or Art. If they prefer technology subjects, they can choose a combination of Design & Technology, Computer Science or Digital Photography. This helps equip them with the skills they need for careers in the 21st century. We feel that no one offers better choice than South Wirral High School.

We have an ethos based on high expectations; we expect high standards of behaviour, excellent attendance and positive attitudes.

We want our students to be creative and flexible thinkers, with high self-esteem and an awareness of the needs of others. In addition we hope to foster a love of academic work for its own sake.


Learning should be enjoyable. Small class sizes help teachers to focus on the needs of every student.

HOUSE SYSTEM

At South Wirral, we have a house structure with four houses named after local families - Laird, Wilson, Stanley and Mayer. Each student belongs to a house from day one.

The House Progress Leader monitors your child's whole educational experience, ensuring that the individual needs of students are met. The House Progress Leader morally, spiritually, socially and culturally helps to educate all students in their care, throughout their time at South Wirral. Parents of Year 7 students are invited into school to meet House staff a short time after the start of the school year, and will act in partnership to ensure your child is supported and encouraged at each stage of their development.

Parents are warmly welcomed to the school to meet the House Progress Leader to discuss any matter or review any difficulties or concerns that their children may be experiencing. It is important to us and your child that parents and House Progress Leaders work in partnership to help raise achievement and promote development.

STUDENT SERVICES

Our Student Services Hub provides a single place students can go to for any pastoral support they may need.

Assistant House Progress Leaders are available throughout the school day to ensure students are prepared to learn to the best of their ability.



SEN

We have high expectations of your child, whatever their ability. From the beginning of their time with us, careful attention is given to identifying and assessing special educational needs by the Code of Practice. The Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator works closely with primary schools to ensure continuity of support for children who have particular learning difficulties which have already been identified at Key Stage 1 & 2.

Programmes are set up for students with Special Needs targeting their individual problems. Teachers are responsible for responsible and accountable for the progress and development of all the pupils they teach. High quality teaching is the first step in responding to students who have SEN or emerging SEN needs. All children, regardless of need, learn alongside their peers wherever possible. Our curriculum is ambitious for all students - we do not differentiate it, we adapt it, to ensure equity.

We make the following adaptations to ensure that all students' needs are met. Please note that this is not an exhaustive list, but a flavour of what students will receive in every lesson across the curriculum:

- 1** By carefully thinking through our seating plans to ensure SEND students have equity of access.
- 2** By understanding individual needs and understanding how to adapt our subject teaching for ASC, ADHD and dyslexia: our three main areas of SEN need.
- 3** By deploying Teaching Assistants effectively, following our "Principles for TA deployment".
- 4** By adapting our teaching resources and teaching environment for neurodiversity.
- 5** All lessons are planned utilising the South Wirral Way structure:



We Support Each Other

Carefully selected small tutor groups are at the heart of our pastoral system. Our tutor groups are developed with a strong focus on structured registration time - tailored to the needs of each year group.

YEARS 7 & 8

Tutors can get to know each student and their family well; they provide individual support and guidance, monitor academic progress and enthuse your child to try something new. Students take part in spelling tests and quizzes, helping with the continuous improvement of literacy and numeracy skills.

YEARS 9 & 10

Discussions in Year 9 & 10 turn to topics such as GCSE options, future aspirations and students' favourite books.

YEAR 11

Many of our Year 11 student groups are led by the faculty leaders of English and Mathematics. This allows students to gain additional support in the lead up to examinations direct from the Head of Faculty every day. The structure allows targeted interventions to take place in a much more strategic way.

STUDENT PLANNERS

We have student planners for all students at South Wirral. This is one of the many initiatives designed to improve our school and is an additional way of communicating with parents allowing you to keep up to date with home learning tasks being set. We ask parents/carers to look at the planner once a week and sign it as part of our 'Home School Agreement'.

We Excel Through High Quality Teaching and Support

SOUTH WIRRAL WAY

At South Wirral High we ensure all students have high quality teaching in all lessons by using a universal structure. This structure is based on the most up to date pedagogy and neuroscience. We call it the South Wirral Way, it's flexible enough to work in all curriculum areas and key stages, and rigorous enough to ensure a consistent high-quality education for all.



RETRIEVAL PRACTICE

At the start of the lesson teachers will ask questions about what has been learned before

I DO

This is where the teacher explains the new knowledge for the lesson, they use stories and analogies to help them.

WE DO

This is where the teacher and the student work together to ensure the student understands the work, there will be some examples or models to help.

YOU DO

This is where students work independently, they are set a challenging task which make them think hard, we call this the 'learning pit' because this is where students use their knowledge and understanding to solve problems and answer questions on their own.

FEEDBACK

Students receive regular feedback on their work in a variety of ways. Students will receive lesson by lesson verbal feedback both individually and as a whole class. They will also have regular written feedback which gives bespoke targets and actions for individuals. Students are asked to use their feedback to improve their work in purple.

SOUTH WIRRAL READS

Here at South Wirral we have a strong reading culture where every student is encouraged to read for their own pleasure as well as for knowledge acquisition. Students who have gaps in reading skills have access to quick, intensive reading interventions which range from phonics to small group reading, the path a student takes is bespoke to their needs.

We ensure that reading is enjoyable, fosters house spirit within school and increases students' chances of being successful in life. We have a brand new library which houses the most recent book releases and is updated regularly.

LORIC Pledges

**LEADERSHIP, ORGANISATION, RESILIENCE,
INITIATIVE AND CHARACTER**

As well as providing an extensive array of courses and learning opportunities within the academic curriculum, we want all of our students to be confident, independent, self-disciplined, participators, performers, communicators, creators and culturally educated.

Providing our students with an enriched curriculum and broad extra-curricular programme of activities, to fully equip them with the skills necessary to be active and successful members of the wider community, is at the heart of our school ethos.

To ensure students receive high-quality enrichment activities and cultural experiences throughout their seven years at South Wirral through key stage 3 to key stage 5, we have written our own LORIC pledges which have been created to ensure all students have access to an all-embracing range of learning experiences outside of the classroom.

Each pledge represents a LORIC standard which signifies Leadership, Organisation, Resilience, Initiative & Character.

Over each key stage, students will be expected to complete at least 5 elements of each LORIC standard. A minimum of 25 pledges will be achieved at each key stage.

The LORIC pledges will form part of the registration activity once a week and tutors will be responsible for recording the accomplishment of each pledge. This will be recorded on Arbor and achievement of these pledges will be celebrated during house assemblies, led by an Assistant House Progress Lead.

Evidence of each pledge achieved will also be recorded and documented in a student progress folder.

Students in years 8-13 can volunteer to be Sports Leaders.

Sports Leaders will assist in running extra-curricular PE clubs, with a specific focus on supporting Unified Sports Club.

Sports Leaders will also have regular opportunities to work with primary school pupils as we visit local schools to deliver inclusion sports and when we host sports festivals at our school.

Sports Leaders will also be called upon to support events across the Wirral and Merseyside, working with partner providers to deliver quality events - including, Panathlon disability festivals and the Wirral School Games inclusion festivals.

Sports Leaders gain value life skills and achieve all of their LORIC Pledges through this volunteering, furthermore, it is a great way to achieve sections of the Duke of Edinburgh Award.

Sports Leaders are involved in delivering programmes from the Youth Sport Trust including, Active in Mind, Healthy Lifestyle Champions, Your Time and Girls Active. 6th Form Sports Leaders will gain the Level 3 Qualification in Sports Leadership.

Together, We Achieve More

South Wirral High School is at the heart of our local community both geographically and in the many ways our students get involved with helping local residents. Whether raising money for the Charles Thompson Mission, working with Claire House Childrens' Hospice or entertaining elderly residents with performances, students are encouraged to 'give back' to their community through our LORIC Pledges programme.

Our regular contact with local primary schools reinforces a close relationship - particularly during the transition period 'moving on up' from primary to secondary. We organise visits from our current students to perform to younger children, and invite primary students into our school to take part in sports festivals. Recent STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) initiatives have seen students join us in exciting and educational activities focused on developing the skills needed for careers in the future. In 2019's 'Space Week' the school provided students with a week of exciting space-themed activities culminating in the launch of a balloon - with payload - into near space.



Students who attended South Wirral High School are also invited in to offer specialist talks to current students to help inspire them on what they can achieve as part of our Alumni network. This includes Shaune Harrison who is now a prosthetic special makeup effects artist and has worked on films such as Harry Potter, The Avengers and Star Wars.
